

Upon completion of the Bachelor of Arts degree in Biblical Studies, the graduate should be able to:

- 1. Identify the history, content, and background of the Bible;
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of fundamentals of Christian doctrine and theology;
- 3. Apply Biblical hermeneutics to an exegetical research project; and
- 4. Demonstrate the importance of the Biblical worldview in Biblical Studies.

The Bachelor of Arts degree is awarded to students who have completed a minimum of sixty-credit hours of study. To complete the degree program, the student must fulfill the core requirements listed below.

Breakdown of Core Curriculum

Semester Course

"The Chemistry of God's Anointing"

COGA111 – Preparing for a New Anointing

This course boldly reveals God's requirements for being entrusted with an awesome power and authority. It speaks directly from God's heart to your heart concerning this most costly anointing.

COGA112 – The Pattern: Christ our Priest, Head and Beginning

This course explores the premise that the chemistry of God's anointing employs the idea that the flow of the anointing initiate from the head down and those that are truly anointed take up His ways and operate in the "pattern" laid by Him.

COGA113 – The Chemistry of God's Anointing

This course reveals the how God's anointing produces more of Christ, The Anointed One in the life of the believer and thus discovery of the secrets to the art of the apothecary.

COGA114 – Master of Chemistry

This course identifies the Master of Chemistry and how the work of the apothecary creates the synergistic affect and the essential essence of this work that both enables and empowers.

COGA115 – People after God's Own Heart

This course focuses on the true anointing that not only worships God but reflects particular characteristics of God's heart.



COGA116 – The Chemistry of Gifts

This course takes a deeper look at the concept of the anointing that blends the ministry gifts provided to the Body of Christ in that it merges individual parts and people into one common use.

COGA117 – God's Provision for the Anointing

In this course as we observe how unity is demonstration through the relinquishing of agendas to embrace and celebrate that outpouring that comes through the ministry of the apothecary.

COGA118 – Finally Without an Excuse

This final course reflects on the synergism that is creates through the art of the apothecary and considers the question: "If it doesn't start in the church then where will it begin?"

Semester Course The Chemistry of the Blood

COTB111 – The Chemistry of the Blood

This course From Genesis to Revelation we see the stream of blood which imparts to this book the very life of God. This course explores the fundamental principle that "Life is in the Blood."

COTB112 – The Chemistry of Calvary

In this course we will discover what is meant by the blood, as "the blood of the cross" from the disposition of our Lord after which the cross derived and the power it has subsequently obtained.

COTB113 – The Chemistry of Light

This course studies the attributes of God the Father as revealed through Jesus Christ the Son and the necessity of walking in His Light.

COTB114 – The Chemistry of the Book

It will become clear that there is no single scriptural idea, from Genesis to Revelation, more constantly and more prominently kept in view, than that expressed by the words—"the Blood."

In this course our inquiry then is what the Scriptures teach us about the Blood.

COTB115 – The Chemistry Prayer

This course examines where in Scripture "prayer" comprises much more than making known our requests to God. In its highest and fullest sense, prayer rises above thanksgiving for gifts bestowed: the heart is drawn out in contemplating the Giver Himself so that the soul is prostrated before him in worship and adoration.

COTB116 – The Chemistry of Faith in the Blood



This course will explore first the faith by which we become partakers of the power of the Blood and second the Blood by which faith manifests its power to enjoy the Blood-bought blessings.

COTB117 – The Chemistry of Fellowship

This chapter demonstrates what God has prepared for us, as the sure ground on which our fellowship with Him may rest and what follows is the preparation to enter into that fellowship, and to live in it.

COTB118 – The Chemistry Man

The final course delves into the essence of 1. He washes us in His Blood, 2. He made us kings and priests, 3. He loved us, and 4. Glory is ascribed to Him forever.

Ministry or Research Project:

Some ideas and suggestions...

 group to a baseball game, volunteer to support their sports activity, teaching life
 lessons and giving affirmation to those who need it most
- Embrace a Women's Shelter or Halfway House. Provide quarterly or semiannually a purse with female products and supplies or male toiletries in a shoebox.
